

CITY OF HARLAN – HARLAN, IOWA – April 04, 2017

The City Council of the City of Harlan, Iowa met pursuant to law and the rules of said Council in regular session in the Council Chambers in City Hall at 5:15 o'clock P.M. the 4th day of April, 2017. The meeting was called to order by Kate Kohorst, Mayor in the Chair, and the following Council members were:

The City Clerk presented the agenda. It was moved by Miller and seconded by Pedersen to approve the agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

The Mayor asked the Council members to state any conflicts of interest, as applicable.

It was moved by Bladt and seconded by Kroger that the following items contained in the Consent Agenda be approved and adopted:

The motion carried and the Consent Agenda items were approved and adopted.

Shelli Larsen was present to discuss the 2017 Shelby County Relay for Life event to be held around the downtown square on 6/02/17. A map designating the area was provided.

It was moved by Kolbe and seconded by Christensen to approve closing 6th, 7th, Market and Court Streets, that border the Shelby County Courthouse, for Relay for Life 6/02/17, from 2 p.m. to 11 p.m., and to allow use of 6th and Durant St. parking lot for Survivor parking. The motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Miller and seconded by Kroger to receive and file the Insurance Committee report of 4/03/17 as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Pedersen and seconded by Christensen to follow the Insurance Committee Recommendation to approve the 7/01/17 Health and Dental Insurance renewal with IGHCP. The motion carried unanimously.

The City Administrator presented his report.

The City Clerk presented her report.

The Mayor presented her report.

It was moved by Pedersen and seconded by Kroger to approve the appointment of Doug D'Arcy & LaVern Holtmyer to the Veterans Memorial Auditorium Commission for a term to expire April 19, 2020. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Christensen and seconded by Kolbe to approve the appointment of Sharon Lucke to the Harlan Historical Preservation Commission for a term to expire 07/01/2019. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Kohorst introduced Ordinance No. 2017-01, entitled “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HARLAN, IOWA (2006) CHAPTER 65.01 - STOP REQUIRED BY ADDING TWO STOP SIGNS”, installing two stop signs at the intersection of Cyclone Avenue & First Street, vehicles traveling east and west on Cyclone Avenue shall stop at First Street.

It was moved by Bladt and seconded by Miller that Ordinance No. 2017-01 now be read for the second time.

A roll call vote was had which was as follows:

The motion carried.

It was moved by Kroger and seconded by Bladt that the third reading of Ordinance No. 2017-01 be dispensed and the ordinance be placed upon its final adoption. A roll call vote was had which was as follows:

The motion carried and the ordinance was duly adopted.

Discussion was held on Chapter 120 – Liquor Licenses and Wine and Beer Permits. The Council directed staff to work with City Attorney Argotsinger to amend Chapter 120, Section 120.05, Item 11, to add a time provision of 10:00 p.m.

There being no further business, the meeting on motion adjourned.
